






## **Special Mentions**

## Curriculum for Wales

As mentioned in last weeks newsletter, the Curriculum for Wales is changing. The Welsh Government talked to adults involved in education, young people in education and parents and families as well as experts in child development and other professionals.

#### They found that


- Adults involved in education wanted to decide what and how they teach.
- Young people in education felt learning was sometimes boring and they were only learning things to pass a test or exam.

Parents and families wanted learning to be more focussed on skills for the future

#### **Research showed**

- Children learn best by doing things.
- Children in different schools needed different experiences.
- Technology and the outdoors need to be used more.
- Young people need to be involved in their learning, planning it, checking it and improving it.

As a result, we have created this visual aid to help children see how the curriculum is changing at Ysgol Maes y Felin.



All of the important things are still in our curriculum, there is just a much bigger focus on developing skills that will help children throughout their lives.

Experts have called these the 'four purposes'.



The four purposes will be at the heart of everything that we teach, learn and experience.

We have created some characters to help us remember each purpose.



We want to help children, parents and staff understand what it looks like when you are ambitious, capable, enterprising, creative, ethical, informed, healthy and confident and embed these values throughout our curriculum.

Here are some examples of how we are achieving the four purposes this week..

### **Ambitious, Capable Learners**

Year 5/6 children have been finding out all about inventors including Thomas Edison and Elon Musk. Year 3/4 have been taking part in a scooter investigation and Bedwen have been applying to NASA to be astronauts.

Year 1/2 have been rehearsing hard for their Christmas Performance and Nursery and Reception have been getting stuck into 'in the moment planning'

#### **Healthy, Confident Individuals**

All children from year 1 – 6 took part in an interactive pantomime from the food standards agency. They also completed a class based workshop to help their understanding of healthy eating. Nursery and Reception have been busy preparing their own snack, they are becoming so independent!

### **Enterprising, Creative Contributors**

Year 5/6 have completed a design and technology project designing items around the world cup, they have created items such as new kits and stadiums. Year 3 and 4 have been getting creative by forming a Christmas choir, it's lovely to hear them practising down the corridor. Bedwen have been creatively thinking of their own mnemonics to help remember the order of the planets and using modge podge and paint to create 3D planets!

Year 1 and 2 have been learning about Mehndi patterns and developed their own examples. Nursery and Reception created their own poppies and with support, went round school selling these to staff for charity – da iawn pawb!

#### **Ethical, Informed Citizens**

Year 5 and 6 have been thinking about human rights and fairness with a focus on the world cup host country Qatar. They have also been leading lesson observations this week, teams of children have gone into each class to observe behaviour throughout the school day, we are looking forward to receiving their feedback next week.

Year 3 and 4 have been watching Newsround and learning about Artemis 1, this is the first in a series of increasingly complex missions that will enable human exploration to the Moon and Mars. Bedwen have also been learning all about the solar system and the attributes needed to be an astronaut.

Year 1 and 2 have been thinking about Hinduism and developing medals for the world cup. Nursery and Reception have been looking at stadiums around the world and recreated these using recycled resources.

## Foundation Phase Christmas Concert

Children throughout Foundation Learning are busy practicing for the Christmas concert. We are looking forward to inviting you along on the 15th of December to watch the concert. This year the children will be performing twice to ensure that all families get the chance to view the concert.

These will be at 1.30pm and the second at 5pm (we ask can children please be back in their classes by 4.45). If your child is **unable** to attend the evening concert, please can you let class teachers know, as we may need to change their role in the concert.

Dear Parents / Carers,

Arrangements have been made for the pupils from Year 1 to 6 to visit the Panto at Theatre Clwyd on Wednesday 14th December, 2022.

In order to make the visit possible, we will require a contribution of  $\mathfrak{L}10.00$  per child which is the cost of the panto ticket only. School will be paying the cost of the transport on this occasion. The cost of the ticket is to be paid via the School Gateway App.

Pupils will return for their lunch and will therefore not require any pocket money or food / drink for the panto. The coach will leave school at 9.00 a.m.

If you wish for your child to see the panto, please go onto the School Gateway App. Your consent for your child to go on this trip will be asked for on the app. Payment should be made no later than Friday 9<sup>th</sup> December.



We are accepting donations of Christmas jumpers that no longer fit - we will then offer these free of charge to other families. Please pass to class teachers.






From November 7th, we will be offering a healthy snack for all children free of charge

#### **Parking**

The area outside the green gate is becoming increasingly dangerous at the start and end of the school day. We have to ensure there is parking for those with a blue badge or children who are allocated transport. All other cars will be stopped at the barrier and asked to park in the visitor car park. There have been two very near misses where children have narrowly avoided being hit by cars. We ask for your co-operation with this to ensure we are keeping everyone safe.
