Wellies in the Woods is a free family learning course, run over 8 one and a half hour long sessions.

Activities vary each week and will include bug hunting, natural crafts, games, den building, and more! All activities as practical and engaging, giving parents and children the opportunity to learn and play together in the outdoors.

Sessions involve wildlife exploration, creativity with nature, and getting active with each session based on some of the most popular children's storybooks!
