We want every child to have the opportunity to do The Daily Mile at primary school, and are now working to build The Daily Mile's community with schools, local councils, sports bodies and other supporters in the UK and beyond.






## **Internet Safety**




From November 7th, we will be offering a healthy snack for all children free of charge
