A Message from Mr Thomas, Acting Headteacher

Prynhawn da.... Good afternoon

Welcome back. Hope you all had a lovely break and enjoyed the time with your families. It has been lovely listening to the children and hearing all about what they have been up to.

It may have been a short week, but the children are already fully in the swing with their work. They all are starting their new exciting topics.

Foxes have shown a keen interest in pets and have created a pet shop and Squirrels have been hooked on dinosaurs. The theme for Year 1/2 is Seven Worlds, One Planet and in Year 3/4 they are exploring Space. Year 5/6 are already engrossed in their topic Climate Change and had a very interesting day today. Bedwen are looking at Danger and are planning a visit to Danger Point this term.

Attendance

There is a big focus by the Welsh Government on attendance this year as it is the first full year for over three years not affected by Covid. The target set for the school is 95% at the moment we stand at 87.31%. I appreciate that the last few weeks before Christmas included a lot of time missed by pupils due to illnesses so hopefully things will improve. We have been assigned an IWO (Inclusion Welfare Officer) Nina Porter, who will be working closely with us and our families to help support pupils to access school. The importance of attending school has a direct impact on the future earnings of each child and also the number of friends they have.

- 1 day off per school year means attendance will only ever reach 99.5%
- 10 days of per school year means attendance will only ever reach 94.7%
- 20 days off per school year means attendance will only ever reach 90%

Poor school attendance can result in academic underachievement, difficulty in making or keeping friendship groups and a loss of child's confidence and self-esteem. Research has proved that children who have poor school attendance when attending primary school are more likely to truant when in secondary schools.

Dogs

At Maes y Felin, we have a 'no dogs on school grounds' policy meaning that dogs cannot go beyond the school gate and into the playground. Only assistance dogs and dogs being used for educational purposes are allowed onto school premises.

This policy is designed for the safety of children and to protect children with allergies. Also, there's nothing worse than dog poo in the playground and on children's shoes!

Pupils Safety

Yesterday saw a near miss between a car and a very young child. We have made every effort to minimise the number of vehicles down at the school gate and there has been a noticeable improvement. However, there are still a number of vehicles which need to access the road outside the gates. Could we please ask those who need to park in the disabled bays to arrive just before 3 o'clock so that they are parked up before the children leave and also as families are walking off the premises that all children (especially very young children) are suitably supervised. This will hopefully help prevent further incidents from occurring.


What have we been up to?



After break the classroom was turned into space and the children made a shelter for them in space using bamboo, tape and newspaper.































Year 3/4 have been busy doing their New Year's resolutions in a picture.



 children.
- We also visit Llys Gwenffrwd Assisted Living Facility on a regular basis, children enjoy chatting to the residents and completing activities as part of our inter-generational project.
- We have recently completed a project with Greenfield Valley, a group of learners went to
 the site and helped to develop an educational resource, we are hoping to return in the new
 year to trial the resource and improve it further. Year 3 and 4 also enjoyed visiting St
 Winefride's Well this term and completed lots of super work based on this back at school.
- PC Mark Sawyer is also starting to develop links with the school, he has come in to work with classes in school on a variety on focused areas including keeping safe.
- We also visit the library and the leisure centre on a regular basis and enjoy accessing the resources and have worked with Holywell Town Council to attend meetings and sing at local events. This term we will be taking part in a community litter pick and we always enjoy

Internet Safety


Following recent reports of unsafe behaviour online, we will be sharing internet safety advice and new information about specific apps each week.

Financial Support

Childcare Offer

Do you or someone you know need help with childcare costs? Under the Childcare Offer for Wales, you could claim up to 30 hours of early education and childcare a week, for up to 48 weeks of the year. This government-funded childcare scheme aims to lessen the burden of childcare costs so that you can spend the money you've saved on the things that matter most to your family.

The Offer has already helped parents from all over Wales to return to work, increase their hours or work more flexibly. If you're looking for a job, or thinking about going back into education or training, but are worried about childcare costs, this support could make all the difference.

Whatever the Offer means for you and your family, don't miss out on your share of this childcare funding.



All parents wishing to receive Childcare Offer for Wales funded childcare from January 2023 will need to apply through the <u>new national digital service</u>. The online service is bilingual and can be accessed via a laptop, mobile phone or tablet.

When applying, you will need:

- Your child's birth certificate
- Proof of address
- Proof of household income or enrolment on a higher or further education course

Free School Meals (eFSM)

Some families who meet certain criteria, for example those on lower incomes or in receipt of certain benefits, are entitled to receive a free school meal (eFSM).

On a successful application for eFSM families are then eligible for other benefits to cover the cost of school essentials such as school uniform grants (PDG).

Even though the roll out of UPFSM will begin in September 2022, and eligible year groups will begin to receive free school meals, families who are eligible for eFSM should continue to use the eFSM application process to ensure they don't lose out on other benefits.

While we're open for lunch (12 - 1.30), you'll be able to go into the Pantry and get a selection of things to stock up your cupboards. The exact amount will depend on what we have received.

We suggest a £2 donation, if you are able, so that this part of the Table can continue.

EMERGENCY SCHOOL CLOSURE NOTIFICATION PROCEDURE

Parents/carers and pupils who are able to access the internet from home.

Flintshire County Council reviewed the procedure for notifying parents/carers and pupils when schools need to close at short notice due to adverse weather conditions or other emergencies. This procedure enables head teachers or nominated back up staff to enter emergency/unplanned school closure details directly onto the Flintshire Website at their earliest convenience via internet access. This ensures speed and accuracy of information, by having all emergency school closure notices in the one place. Parents etc. can then check the one source for all schools closed, especially where siblings are attending different schools. (Please note schools may still use their own method also for supplying closure information i.e. School Website, Schools Call Voice mail service etc.)

In order to find the Flintshire County Council webpage in times of severe weather emergencies etc. that could affect schools opening, please visit the website Home page www.flintshire.gov.uk. A link will direct you straight to the webpage with the full information details entered by the head teacher or the nominated back up staff.

Please Note: At 5.00PM each day the information on the school closure website page will be deleted automatically. Head teachers from 5.30PM onwards, can then enter the next day's information regarding closure, if known in advance. Otherwise any new closure information will be entered early the following morning.

Parents/carers and pupils who are unable to access the internet at home.

 a) Local radio stations are advised to check the Flintshire web site for the latest information and they can then broadcast it accordingly. So those without internet access should listen to Radio Wales or Heart FM to find out the latest information.

b) Or alternatively refer to schools own procedures for notifying parents without internet access.

Email notification to parents/carers/pupils

Flintshire County Council has set up additional assistance to parents/carers/pupils who may wish to be notified by email of any school closures as soon as they are logged by the school on the Flintshire County Council website. To receive school closure email notification you will need to register your details and which schools you wish to be notified of on:-

At the end of each school year an email containing a link will be sent to all parents/carers etc who have registered to ask if wish to remain registered to receive emails for the following school year for the same schools. All parents/carers who do not respond via the link (by the confirmed date) will have their details automatically removed.

Please can I remind parents / carers how important it is, that if your child is not going to be in school, please can you contact the office on 01352 711366 as soon as possible, otherwise this will be marked as an unauthorised absence.

Attendance - what are we doing to improve this?

- Increased parental engagement through stay and play sessions for each year group.
- Increased family engagement through inviting all classes to a child led assembly, to stay for lunch and attend a school session alongside their child.
 - Free school meal roll out
 - A new childcare provision to ensure wrap around care as part of the childcare offer.
 - Identifying children at risk of persistent absenteeism and supporting them in school
 - A school-based family liaison officer and additional need co-ordinator
 - Inclusion welfare team based in school
