What has been happening in school this week

Another busy week here at Maes Y Felin and the children are now back in the full flow of school life.

Monday and Tuesday saw PC Mark come in and work with year 3/4 and 5/6 regarding unsafe substances. The children worked well and showed excellent maturity when discussing the work.

This week saw each class nominate their representatives for the Pupil Voice Groups. The pupil voice groups are a very strong part of our school and they help organise and run different events during the year. We have six groups Digital Leaders, ECO, School Council, Rights Respecting, Criw Cymraeg and Well-Being Champions. The children had a visit from PC Mark all about how to keep safe and who to trust around them. They had fun creating their own online word search about all the people who help them in Cymraeg. In Language the children have started the Book 'Grandpa's Island' and are enjoying using pictures as a vehicle for their writing. The quality of writing is such a high standard so keep up the reading at home as this is definitely giving the children lots of ideas when they put pen to paper! Just in case the children haven't mentioned it yet, they get 2 Dojos each time they read at home and bring their book in, just remember to write a comment in their 'Reading Record' and the children will be thrilled to receive their 2 Dojo's! Year 5 and 6 have loved reading our new class book, 'The Boy At The Back of the Class', which is all about a Syrian refugee. We've used our research skills to find out information about Syria. Some of the 5/6 shared their learning experiences with the rest of the class from last week when Will from Technocamp came in to do a cryptology workshop. It was a fantastic opportunity to learn about Caesar and pigpen ciphers, crack codes and develop their own. At the end we used our new skills to decrypt several messages and open a locked box. Great teamwork from all!

Uniform Expectation

We are having increasing amounts of children attending school with dangly earrings, make up and false nails.

We would like to remind you about our School Uniform Policy.

- 1. Earrings small stud earrings are permitted please avoid oversized or dangly earrings.
- 2. No make up is permitted, children attending school wearing make up, will be asked to remove this.
- 3. False nails are not permitted at school.

School Essentials Grant

Children whose families are on lower incomes and <u>qualify for certain benefits</u> can apply for a grant of:

• £125 per learner

• £200 for learners entering year 7 (to help with increased costs associated with starting secondary school)

All compulsory school years from reception to year 11 are now eligible.

All looked after children qualify for the grant, whether they receive free school meals or not. Learners who receive free school meals due to transitional protection arrangements do not qualify.


Families are only entitled to claim once per child, per school year.

The 2023 to 2024 scheme is now open and will close on 31 May 2024.


Parental Engagement Opportunities


