Squirrels and Foxes

It has been another busy week in Foxes and Squirrels class. We have been continuing with our 'Three Little Pigs' story. The children worked in small groups to do their own recount, and it was lovely to hear them telling the story in their own words.

In Foxes, we have been learning how to take off and put on our own coats to improve our gross motor skills and independence.

In Squirrels, the children have loved playing with bubbles. We decided to do an experiment to find out what ingredients make the best bubbles. We thought about what we could use. The children decided to use fairy liquid, shampoo, soap, and bubble bath. They very much enjoyed making their own bubble mixtures and experimenting to see which mixture made the best bubbles.

We are very proud of both classes. Ardderchog!










Owls, Badgers and Hedgehogs

Uniform Expectation

We are having increasing amounts of children attending school with dangly earrings, make up and false nails.

We would like to remind you about our School Uniform Policy.

- 1. Earrings small stud earrings are permitted please avoid oversized or dangly earrings.
- 2. No make up is permitted, children attending school wearing make up, will be asked to remove this.
- 3. False nails are not permitted at school.

School Essentials Grant

Children whose families are on lower incomes and <u>qualify for certain benefits</u> can apply for a grant of:

- £125 per learner
- £200 for learners entering year 7 (to help with increased costs associated with starting secondary school)

All compulsory school years from reception to year 11 are now eligible.

All looked after children qualify for the grant, whether they receive free school meals or not. Learners who receive free school meals due to transitional protection arrangements do not qualify.

Families are only entitled to claim once per child, per school year.

The 2023 to 2024 scheme is now open and will close on 31 May 2024.


