What has been happening in school this week

Squirrels and Foxes

In Foxes and Squirrels this week we have been looking at the properties of materials to see if they were waterproof or not. We wanted to make sure that if we built a new house for the Three little pigs that it would be waterproof and that they would be protected. We made some predictions first and then tested them out to see if we were right. The children loved doing this activity! Next, they had to think about what material they would use for their roof and they had to test it using a watering can and see if they were right. Have a look at some of their wonderful houses.

In Read Write Inc this week we have learnt the sounds g, o, c and k. We have learnt to recognise and form the letters, we also went on a letter hunt around the school looking for these letters.

The children have been practising using scissors to cut minibeasts, look at what an amazing job that they have done. The children all know that they must only handle scissors when they are sitting on a chair facing a table to keep themselves and others safe.





Derwen a Ceiriosen

Both classes have been learning all about map drawing skills and have used Google Earth to find Holywell and draw key features of the high street using a key.






















Masarnen, Collen a Llwyfen

Uniform Expectation

We are having increasing amounts of children attending school with dangly earrings, make up and false nails.

We would like to remind you about our School Uniform Policy.

- 1. Earrings small stud earrings are permitted please avoid oversized or dangly earrings.
- 2. No make up is permitted, children attending school wearing make up, will be asked to remove this.
- 3. False nails are not permitted at school.

School Essentials Grant

Children whose families are on lower incomes and <u>qualify for certain benefits</u> can apply for a grant of:

- £125 per learner
- £200 for learners entering year 7 (to help with increased costs associated with starting secondary school)

All compulsory school years from reception to year 11 are now eligible.

All looked after children qualify for the grant, whether they receive free school meals or not. Learners who receive free school meals due to transitional protection arrangements do not qualify.

Families are only entitled to claim once per child, per school year.

The 2023 to 2024 scheme is now open and will close on 31 May 2024.
