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# What's been happening in school this week


#### **Squirrels and Foxes**


















#### **Owls, Badgers and Hedgehogs**




In Maths they have been learning about how to transfer the data they collected in their Science experiment to draw bar graphs on graph paper.

Thank you for those of you who came to support our Reading Cafe. Don't forget our next Reading Cafe is Thursday 1st February at 2.30pm.






















#### **Bedwen**



















### **Enfys**

#### **Collection from School**

From September 2023 ONLY children in year 5 and 6 can walk home without an adult and this will only be allowed once we have had written permission from parents/carers. All other children must be collected by an adult. Please let us know if someone different is collecting your children, if you would like a password system set up, please speak to class teachers or the office.

#### Clubs

#### **Zero Tolerance**

Aggressive, violent and threatening behaviour towards school staff will not be tolerated. Individuals behaving aggressive or violently towards school staff will be asked to leave the premises and reported to the police.

#### School Essentials Grant

Children whose families are on lower incomes and <u>qualify for certain benefits</u> can apply for a grant of:

- £125 per learner
- £200 for learners entering year 7 (to help with increased costs associated with starting secondary school)

All compulsory school years from reception to year 11 are now eligible.

All looked after children qualify for the grant, whether they receive free school meals or not. Learners who receive free school meals due to transitional protection arrangements do not qualify.

Families are only entitled to claim once per child, per school year.

The 2023 to 2024 scheme is now open and will close on 31 May 2024.
