What's been happening in school this week

Squirrels and Foxes

In Foxes and Squirrels this week we have been listening to instructions and giving instructions using prepositions in mathematical development. The children were great at listening where to put the block/teddy. They were even able to give instructions to adult. Gwaith Bendigedig plant.

In language and communication this week we have been thinking about ingredients that we will need to make Gingerbread men. The children have been busy writing shopping lists so we know exactly what to buy. Our Reception children have been using their phonic knowledge to sound out words and listen for initial sounds. Our Nursery children have been practising holding a pencil correctly and emergent writing.

Next week, when we have all the ingredients we will be making Gingerbread men to sell. We are going to design posters and we will be taking turns to measure out the ingredients to make the Gingerbread. We will be selling them for £1, keep your eye on seesaw for more Gingerbread news!

In Foxes, we have been creating artwork for a new display 'A Gruffalo's Child' making animals and snowy trees. In Squirrels we have been looking at space and we have been setting up a new area exploring space.

A big thank you to all of the parents who attended Squirrels stay and play, the children thoroughly enjoyed having you in class it was great to see such a positive turn out.



Owls, Badgers and Hedgehogs

In addition to our learning about Rama and Sita, the students in Owls, Hedgehogs, and Badgers have been exploring the concept of light as we continue to celebrate Diwali, the festival of light. We have been discussing different sources of light, including both natural and man-made types.

To further our understanding, we conducted an outdoor activity where we examined various materials to see if any of them were reflective to light. This hands-on experience allowed the children to engage with the topic and discover how different surfaces can interact with light.

The students in the Owls class had the opportunity to visit the library this week. During their visit, they were able to create their own bookmarks and select a book to bring back to school. It was a

delightful experience for the children, as they eagerly searched the shelves to find books about their favourite subjects.

Wow these weeks are flying by so fast, before we know it the festive period will be upon us! The children in Derwen and Ceiriosen have been busy creating their adventure stories and continue to enjoy adding their own ideas to the structured paragraphs. Wait till they've finished, we're sure there will be lots of fantastic stories that everyone would love to read!

In Maths this week the children have enjoyed consolidating their knowledge of column addition and subtraction by looking at word problems and they have been outside using chalk to demonstrate their ability of regrouping with 4-digit numbers before they move on to the next unit of work.

The Reading Café has had a very successful 2nd week and we are so grateful to the Parents/Grandparents/Carers who came and supported their children with their reading in Derwen. We can't thank you enough for getting involved and really appreciate the time you are giving by coming in. Everyone is more than welcome and we would love to see more of you next week. 

Collection from School

From September 2023 ONLY children in year 5 and 6 can walk home without an adult and this will only be allowed once we have had written permission from parents/carers. All other children must be collected by an adult. Please let us know if someone different is collecting your children, if you would like a password system set up, please speak to class teachers or the office.

Zero Tolerance

Aggressive, violent and threatening behaviour towards school staff will not be tolerated. Individuals behaving aggressive or violently towards school staff will be asked to leave the premises and reported to the police.

School Essentials Grant

Children whose families are on lower incomes and <u>qualify for certain benefits</u> can apply for a grant of:

- £125 per learner
- £200 for learners entering year 7 (to help with increased costs associated with starting secondary school)

All compulsory school years from reception to year 11 are now eligible.

All looked after children qualify for the grant, whether they receive free school meals or not. Learners who receive free school meals due to transitional protection arrangements do not qualify.

Families are only entitled to claim once per child, per school year.

The 2023 to 2024 scheme is now open and will close on 31 May 2024.
