We start the Newsletter with some good news. We have been shortlisted by the judges in the Wellbeing Award of the Year category in the Leader Education Awards 2024.

I am so proud of all the hard work all of our staff put into making our children have the best opportunities every day.

Fingers crossed now that we win the category. More news to follow in March. The children are now fully back into the swing of things and are producing some lovely pieces of work which you will see further into the Newsletter.

Year 5/6 continued their work with Stem on Wednesday and I know the children are really enjoying the project they are working on. Wednesday also saw Mrs. Martin take six of her Eco group up to the hospital where they are working on an intergenerational project. We are very excited about this.

Thursday was another busy day which saw Mrs. Saunders take seven pupils from the school council to visit the Chairperson of the County Council in the Council Chambers in Mold. The children did the school proud and asked some great questions. I think the power of being in charge has got to some of them and they have lots of ideas for school. In the afternoon we celebrated Santes Dwynwen day

with a disco which they loved. The children were also able to use their tocyn iath that they had earned from speaking Welsh around school to buy some treats.





What's been happening in school this week

Squirrels and Foxes

We have been continuing our learning on owl babies this week by working in groups to identify a breed of owl and then completing a fact file about it. We a have been using our digital skills to make our own I movies by creating frames using the owls from the Owl babies' story. We have been moving them and taking a photo each time and using the voice recorder adding a voice note about what is happening in that frame. We have listened to a selection of music and we have chosen one that we think is the most appropriate. The children have loved completing this activity and they are building on their digital competences every day.

In Maths, we have been trying to beat our previous scores using the RM maths app. We have also been looking at subitising both inside and outside the class.

This week the children have been developing their creativity skills, they created digital sea creatures and have made ocean scenes using recycled materials.


In Math's they have been learning about coordinates, they used these skills within their topic work to create a map and to determine the coordinates located on the maps.

Badgers class have been designing a well-being box to promote positive engagement, emphasising the importance of well-being in our learning space.




















Derwen and Ceiriosen


























Tall poppies project linked with Holywell Hospital

We are lucky to be able to attend a weekly session at the hospital working with patients with dementia. Six of our year 5 Eco children have been chosen to attend these sessions every Monday. The aim of the project is for the children to work closely with the patients on Art and Wildlife projects building relationships and increasing their self-esteem. The sessions are run by Katie who works at the hospital and Isa Lamb who facilitates workshops based on the environment. The session on Wednesday was all about the Robin Red breast. It was fascinating to hear that robins across the world are different colours depending on their environment. We were played the robins bird song as the children and patients made their own interpretations on paper. It is safe to say that the children really got stuck in and it wasn't long before there was glitter and feathers everywhere! Collection from School

Zero Tolerance

Aggressive, violent and threatening behaviour towards school staff will not be tolerated. Individuals behaving aggressive or violently towards school staff will be asked to leave the premises and reported to the police.

School Essentials Grant

Children whose families are on lower incomes and <u>qualify for certain benefits</u> can apply for a grant of:

• £125 per learner

• £200 for learners entering year 7 (to help with increased costs associated with starting secondary school)

All compulsory school years from reception to year 11 are now eligible.

All looked after children qualify for the grant, whether they receive free school meals or not. Learners who receive free school meals due to transitional protection arrangements do not qualify.

Families are only entitled to claim once per child, per school year.

The 2023 to 2024 scheme is now open and will close on 31 May 2024.
