
# What's been happening in school this week


of art work mirroring her style. The children decided to learn all about the former Wales Rugby player Richard Parks and they enjoyed creating posters, presentations and animations.

Friday was Ceiriosen's assembly about Chinese New year and how it is celebrated. The children did absolutely fantastic, da iawn pawb!!

































#### **Bedwen**




## Masarnen, Collen a Llwyfen





## School Information

#### Access

#### Nuts

We are a nut free school, please ensure there are no nut based foods brought on to the premises.

#### **Collection from School**

From September 2023 ONLY children in year 5 and 6 can walk home without an adult and this will only be allowed once we have had written permission from parents/carers. All other children must be collected by an adult. Please let us know if someone different is collecting your children, if you would like a password system set up, please speak to class teachers or the office.

#### **Holiday Form**

If you wish to take your children on holiday during term time, can you please fill out the below Holiday Request Form, at least 7 days before the first day of absence.

#### Clubs

After school clubs for Autumn are available to book on school cloud.

#### **Zero Tolerance**

Aggressive, violent and threatening behaviour towards school staff will not be tolerated. Individuals behaving aggressive or violently towards school staff will be asked to leave the premises and reported to the police.

## School Essentials Grant

Children whose families are on lower incomes and <u>qualify for certain benefits</u> can apply for a grant of:

- £125 per learner
- £200 for learners entering year 7 (to help with increased costs associated with starting secondary school)

All compulsory school years from reception to year 11 are now eligible.

All looked after children qualify for the grant, whether they receive free school meals or not. Learners who receive free school meals due to transitional protection arrangements do not qualify.

Families are only entitled to claim once per child, per school year.

The 2023 to 2024 scheme is now open and will close on 31 May 2024.
