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A Message from Mr Thomas, Headteacher



Prynhawn da/Good Afternoon,

It has been a short working week here at Maes Y Felin but there has still been a lot going on as the half term draws to a close.

Firstly, we would like to apologise for the school being closed yesterday. These decisions are not taken lightly and were made by the Council's Emergency Management Team based on detailed Met Office data which placed many parts of the county on an amber weather warning for snow. Happily, we were able to open today allowing us to finish off the half term.

We also have made the decision to postpone Ceiriosen Class Service until we return back.

We have had an increasing number of incidents where members of staff have been spoken to in an aggressive manner and using inappropriate language. I would like to remind you that we operate a zero tolerance here at school and repeat behaviour can lead to parents being banned from the premises. Whilst we understand that there are times where you may be frustrated with something that happens, we ask you to make an appointment to discuss the matter in private.

Also, after feedback from parents we will be changing how the children in Year 3/4 (Derwen and Ceiriosen) are dismissed from school at the end of the day from Monday February 19th . We ask that parents from both classes to only come onto the yard once the classes and approach your child's class. Derwen will be situated to the left of the gate and Ceiriosen to the right by the parasol.

We are hoping this will elevate the bottle neck in front of the gates and ensure all children safely find their guardian. We will review this method at the end of next term.

On Tuesday the Netball team produced some good performances at the County Tournament which meant they finished third in their group. Mrs Saunders was very proud of the team. Da iawn pawb.

On Wednesday the Year 5/6 classes finished their Stem Workshops and the parents were invited in to see what they had been up to during their sessions. The children enjoyed having their parents in and were very proud to show off their work.

We return after the break to a very busy week. On Monday year 5/6 continue with their Airbus Workshops, Tuesday will see the pupils who have been working on the Children's University visit Wrexham University, Year3/4 will have a visit from Progress Energy to help support their topic work and finally Friday sees Ceiriosen have their class service.

We have been learning new words to describe animals who come out in the day (diurnal) and animals that come out at night (nocturnal) and we have been sorting them into two groups.




Both classes got to enjoy an Aura sports session this week. The children love to develop new skills and have been playing the newly learnt games during playtimes.

Owls, Badgers and Hedgehogs

In Owls, Badgers & Hedgehogs this week we have been making our vessels that we planned last week. We have been using recycled materials to create our vessels.

In Badgers' maths class this week they have been focusing on using the correct mathematical language for comparing different objects (e.g. smaller or taller, longer or shorter). In Owls' maths we have also been focusing on measure and developed our understanding of measuring using centimetres, we have been measuring objects around our classroom. In Hedgehogs' maths they have been adding different amounts of money and challenging themselves using the coins.



Derwen and Ceiriosen
























Bedwen







Collection from School

From September 2023 ONLY children in year 5 and 6 can walk home without an adult and this will only be allowed once we have had written permission from parents/carers. All other children must be collected by an adult. Please let us know if someone different is collecting your children, if you would like a password system set up, please speak to class teachers or the office.

Zero Tolerance

Aggressive, violent and threatening behaviour towards school staff will not be tolerated. Individuals behaving aggressive or violently towards school staff will be asked to leave the premises and reported to the police.

School Essentials Grant

Children whose families are on lower incomes and <u>qualify for certain benefits</u> can apply for a grant of:

- £125 per learner
- £200 for learners entering year 7 (to help with increased costs associated with starting secondary school)

All compulsory school years from reception to year 11 are now eligible.

All looked after children qualify for the grant, whether they receive free school meals or not. Learners who receive free school meals due to transitional protection arrangements do not qualify.

Families are only entitled to claim once per child, per school year.

The 2023 to 2024 scheme is now open and will close on 31 May 2024.
